Fred has received word from Latrobe City that the market power supply was approved, the contractor advised, and that it should happen any day.

Fred has had significant input into what will be required, with two distribution boards to be installed. The overall cost is around the \$20,000 mark, so quite significant.

This will relieve the problems (we hope) that we encounter from time to time with the generator. Plus, the generator needs to be picked up prior to the market and returned on the Monday after a market, all time consuming.


We are targeting the March Market as the time of the big switch to mains power. Let's hope we meet that target with as little fuss as possible!
